I would like to explore possible conflict resolutions and peacebuilding mechanisms for Mexico's ongoing crisis with drug trafficking organizations (DTOs), possibly focusing on the granting of amnesties, the use of criminal tribunals, Demobilization Disarmament and Reintegration (DDR) measures, or other such mechanisms. I would like to construct my analysis using the Colombian peace process as an analogous case. In this way, I would assess the successes and shortcomings of the Colombian peace process, and then extrapolate those findings to the Mexican case in order to identify effective methods to end the ongoing conflict and construct sustainable peace.
