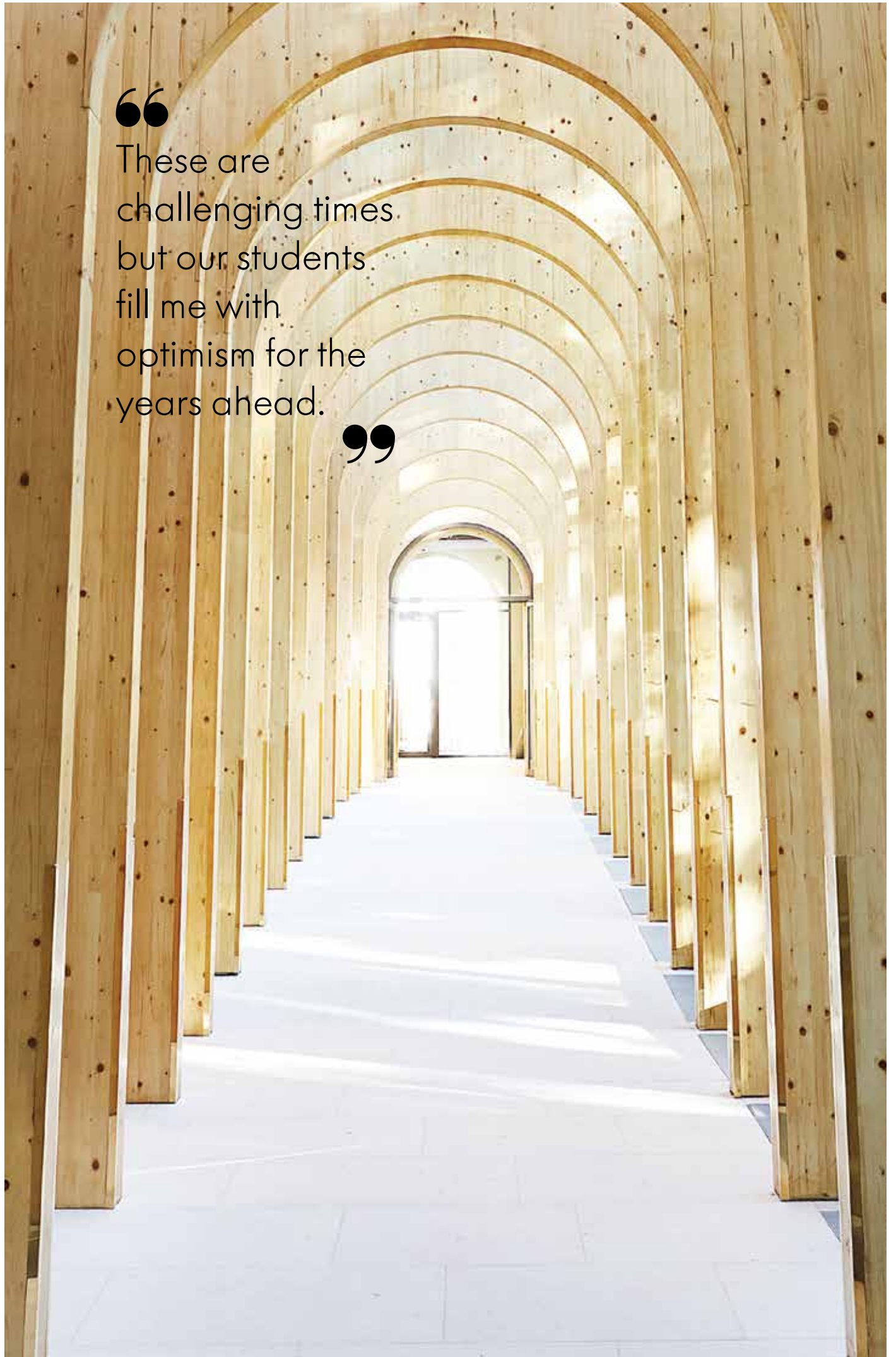

Graduate scholarship brings India to Oxford

DR MRS AMBRITI SALVE WAS A REMARKABLE WOMAN. SHE WAS A LEADING DOCTOR IN INDIA AND SO, WHEN HER SON HARISH SALVE – A FORMER SOLICITOR GENERAL OF INDIA – WAS CONSIDERING HOW BEST TO CELEBRATE HER ACHIEVEMENTS, HE CHOSE TO USE HER AS INSPIRATION FOR SUPPORTING FUTURE GENERATIONS OF TALENTED LAW SCHOLARS.

This led to the establishment of the Dr Mrs Ambriti Salve Scholarship at Exeter: a scholarship which provides vital financial support for graduate students from India to study the BCL.

Such generosity has already enabled seven graduates to pursue their academic aspirations since the scholarship began in 2009. One of these is Mariyam Kamil, whose Exeter story began when she undertook her BCL in 2013.

Mariyam, who studied Law as an undergraduate at Hyderabad University, began her legal career as an intern with the Chief Justice of India.

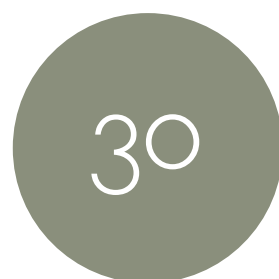
“It was a bit surreal,” she comments, “because all the biggest cases go through the Supreme Court of India. I had always wanted to pursue the BCL and the course at Oxford is the best in the world thanks to the tutorial system.”

She arrived at Exeter on a Felix Scholarship, and was then awarded the Dr Mrs Ambriti Salve Scholarship upon beginning the MPhil. Her success has resulted in her scholarship continuing for the first two years of her DPhil.

“The Scholarship has given me a wonderful opportunity to focus on my research into rights to privacy. There has been an increase in research in the Indian law world which provides new opportunities for students to undertake high quality research in many fields.”

The impact of the Scholarship has not only benefited Mariyam’s research but has also enabled her to enjoy her studies without added financial pressures. With a long-term goal of returning to India, and an ambition to be part of the judiciary, Mariyam is enjoying her time in Oxford.

“The Scholarship has been a great relief to me, allowing me to have more of a stress-free experience than I would otherwise have done,” she explains. “Exeter has been such a welcoming environment and I felt at home here very quickly.”

Musical legacy inspires students

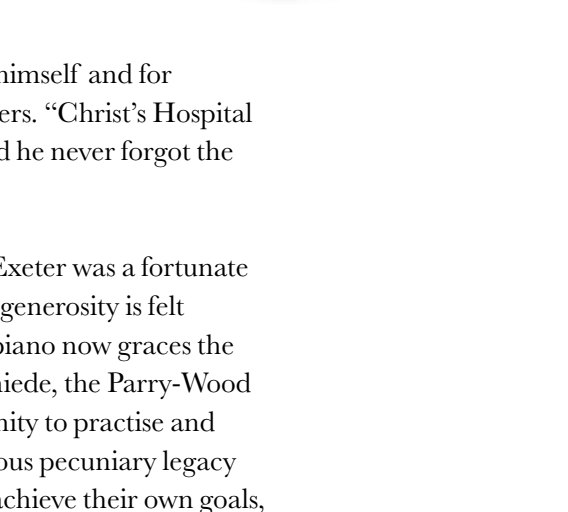
RONALD TIDMARSH'S GREAT PASSION THROUGHOUT HIS LIFE WAS MUSIC. THANKS TO HIS GENEROUS LEGACY, TODAY'S STUDENTS ARE ABLE TO EMBARK ON THEIR OWN MUSICAL JOURNEYS.

Ronald (pictured right, as a member of the 1947–48 rugby team) came up from London in 1947 to study Music, German, History and English. His admission to Oxford was never guaranteed: family letters illustrate the need for additional financial assistance for Ronald's aspirations to become a reality. Fortunately, he received a scholarship together with funding from Christ's Hospital, where he had boarded since the age of nine.

Although his time at Exeter was interrupted by two years of National Service as a fighter plotter with the Royal Air Force, he was able to complete his DipEd and BA in 1952, later pursuing a career as a teacher. Life as a teacher enabled him to fulfil his love of travel by taking up roles in Cairo, Switzerland and the Netherlands.

“Education was always at the forefront of his being, for himself and for everyone around him” his niece, Jackie Glover, remembers. “Christ's Hospital and Exeter College were of great importance to him and he never forgot the benefits of his time there.”

When he passed away in January 2017 at the age of 87, Exeter was a fortunate and grateful beneficiary of his estate. The impact of his generosity is felt daily in the Exeter family: his much-loved Bosendorfer piano now graces the Chapel. It is often played by students such as Bartosz Thiede, the Parry-Wood Organ Scholar (pictured right), who enjoys the opportunity to practise and perform on this special instrument. In addition, a generous pecuniary legacy provides support for today's students to enable them to achieve their own goals, much as Ronald did 70 years ago.

It took the final push of my accountant to tell me how tax efficient it was for me and how I could tax deduct a good proportion of whatever I donated, before I donated. Since then I haven’t looked back and have forged a great relationship with College and can see how many students my donations have benefited. I have really enjoyed that.”

Exeter’s regular giving programme provides much-needed funding for our highly-prized tutorial system. Thanks to you, Exeter students, such as Tom Hunt (pictured left), can delve deeper into their chosen subject.

“Since coming to Oxford, I’ve found that tutorials have really helped me develop an in-depth understanding of my subject,” Tom comments. “They provide a venue for discussion with experts in your subject that you just can’t get from lectures or written feedback alone. The small groups they’re conducted in means you’re unafraid to experiment with ideas and approaches.”

The East Asia Travel Scholarship offers Exeter students an unrivalled opportunity to explore East Asia for a minimum of four weeks. Coupled with the opportunity to meet alumni *en route*, this enables students to explore their passions in a completely new environment.

Rebecca Iles was the inaugural recipient of the East Asia Travel Scholarship. Now in her third year reading PPE, Rebecca grew up in Kettering where she attended a faith-based school: an experience which sparked a lasting interest in religions around the world. “Studying Philosophy is a natural extension of my interest in world religions,” she says. “It was a tremendous experience to explore East Asia and learn more about the region’s faiths. Also, I didn’t have an opportunity to have a gap year and I love travelling, so this enabled me to combine my two great passions.”

Rebecca’s adventure began in Singapore, where she enjoyed an introduction to Harmony Day celebrations (held annually on the 21st of July, the day celebrates Singapore’s diverse heritage and culture) and got to know women of faith from Buddhist and Taoist communities. Further opportunities to explore Buddhism were found during her travels in Thailand and Myanmar, and the adventure finished in Hong Kong, where Rebecca met several Exeter alumni.

“One of the key learnings from the trip was that, in the West, religion is often associated with older generations,” Rebecca observes. “I noticed in Myanmar that younger generations are just as involved and I felt that this gave me a genuine view of the culture there.”

Clearly, the experience has left a strong impression on her.

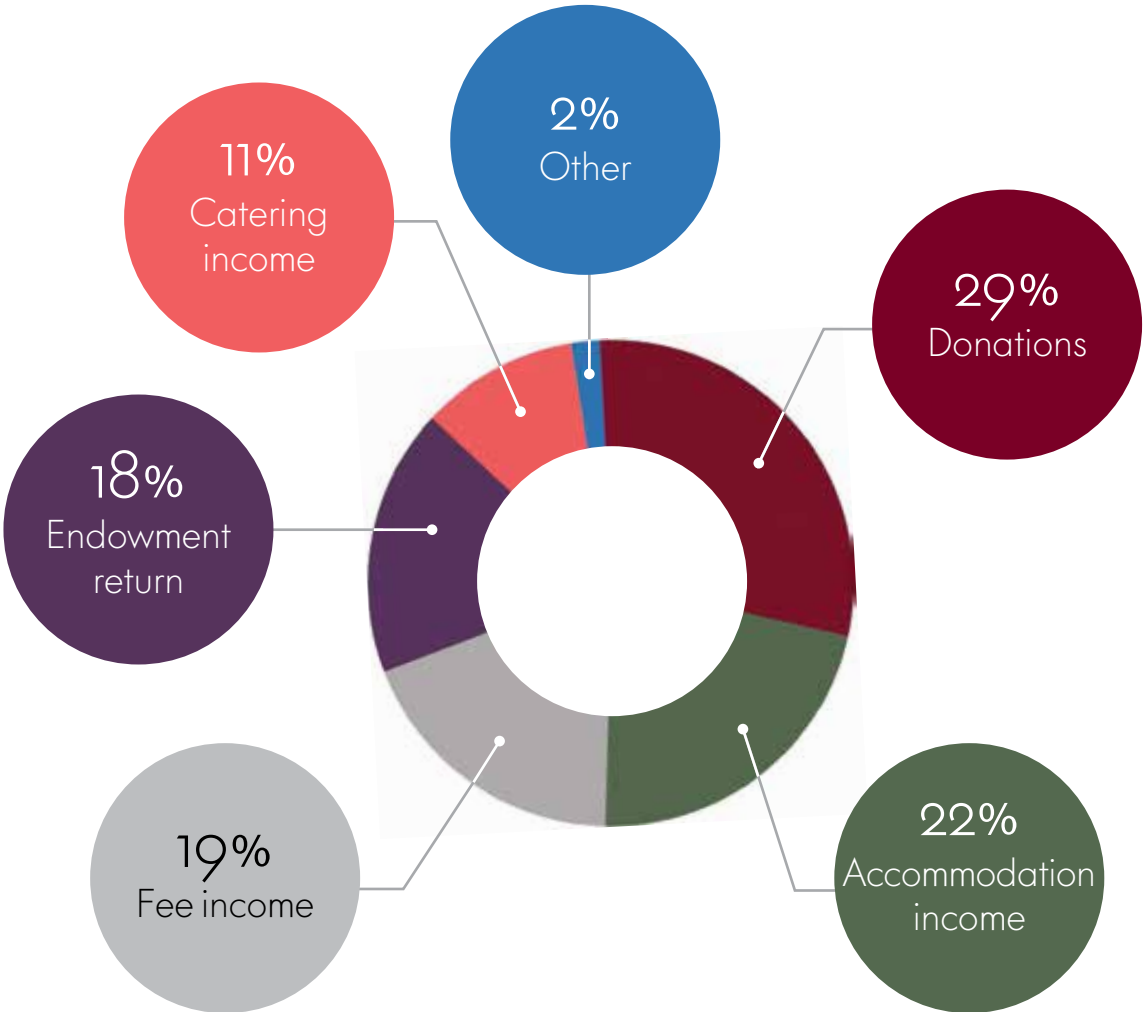
2016–17: The year in numbers

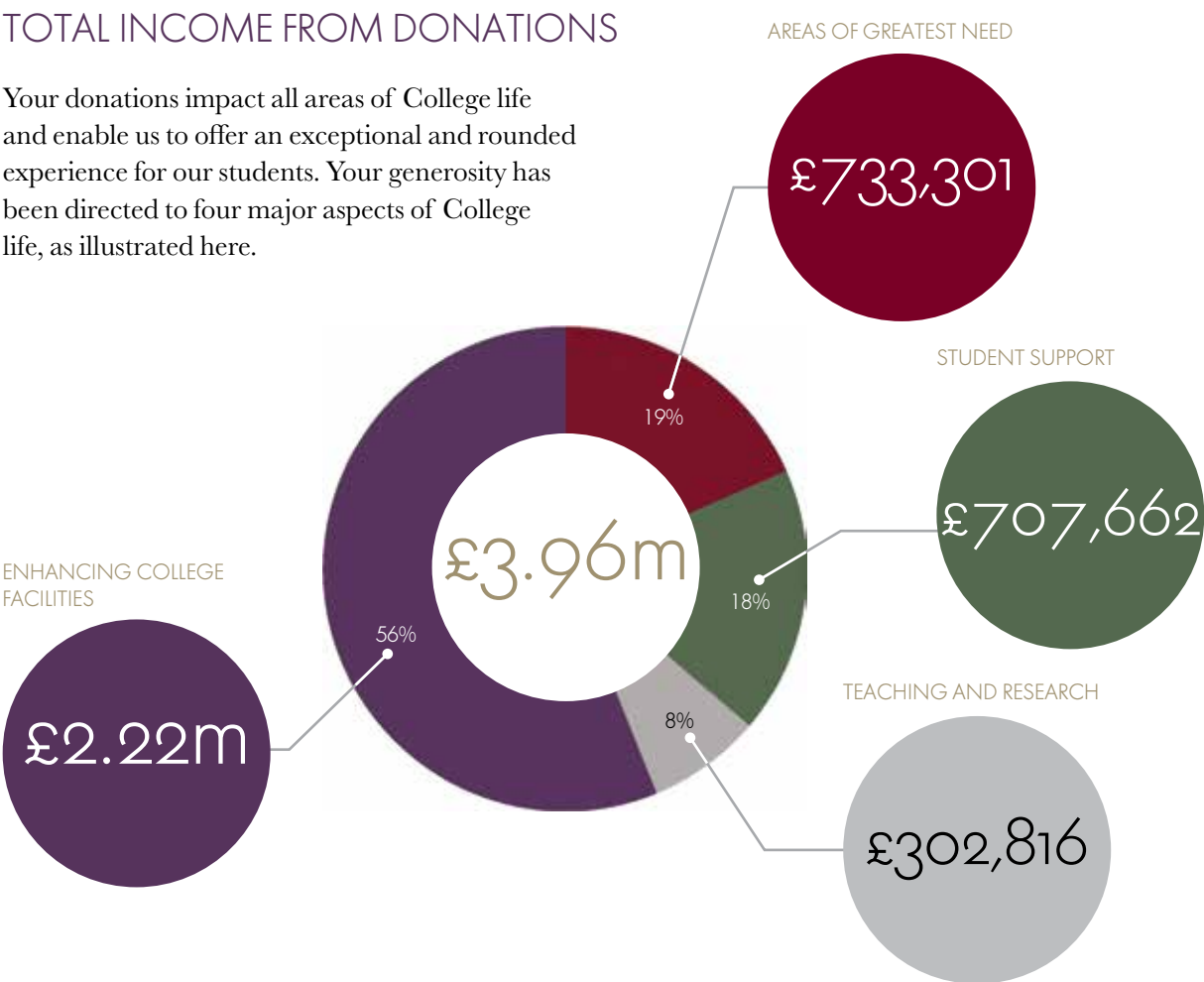
