21 April Week 1	Eastertide Festal Eucharist <i>The Chapel Reader</i>
28 April Week 2	Choral Evensong <i>Maria Noth is the CEO of the Frauenkirche in Dresden, a church rebuilt in the 2000s, having been bombed in WW2 and left as ruins during the Cold War. It now has a focus on reconciliation.</i>
5 May Week 3	Choral Evensong <i>The Rev'd Mark Birch was Chaplain of Exeter, and now is Precent of Westminster Abbey. He was responsible for the liturgy of the Coronation.</i>
12 May Week 4	Choral Evensong <i>The Rev'd Jonathan Kester is the Vicar of St Peter's Eaton Square, in London.</i>
19 May Week 5	Choral Eucharist for the feast of Pentecost <i>The Catechist preaches on Spirit and Charism.</i>
26 May Week 6	Choral Evensong on the feast of the Holy and Undivided Trinity <i>The Rev'd Josh Barrett Tracey is priest in charge of the Church for the Redeemer, Philadelphia.</i>
2 June Week 7	Choral Evensong <i>The Rev'd Prof Mark Chapman is the Vice Principal of Ripon College, Cuddesdon, and Professor of the History of Modern Theology here in Oxford.</i>
9 June Week 8	Commemoration of Benefactors <i>The Very Reverend Dr David Hoyle is the Dean of Westminster.</i>
16 June Week 9	3.00pm Leavers' Service <i>The Chaplain</i>
