Two Sites: Historic and Modern



Exeter College is in the heart of Oxford – the city and the University. It comprises two vibrant sites – the historic site located on Turl Street and Cohen Quadrangle on Walton Street. Both sites are just 10 minutes' walk from the train station. They are close to University libraries, laboratories, the Saïd Business School and the Blavatnik School of Government, as well as Oxford's newly developed Radcliffe Observatory Quarter.

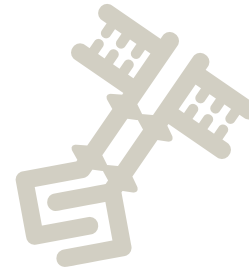
Availability

FitzHugh Auditorium

The versatile lecture theatre space is lit with natural light and can seat up to 100 people. The room can be reorganised for screenings, performances, and for a formal banquet.

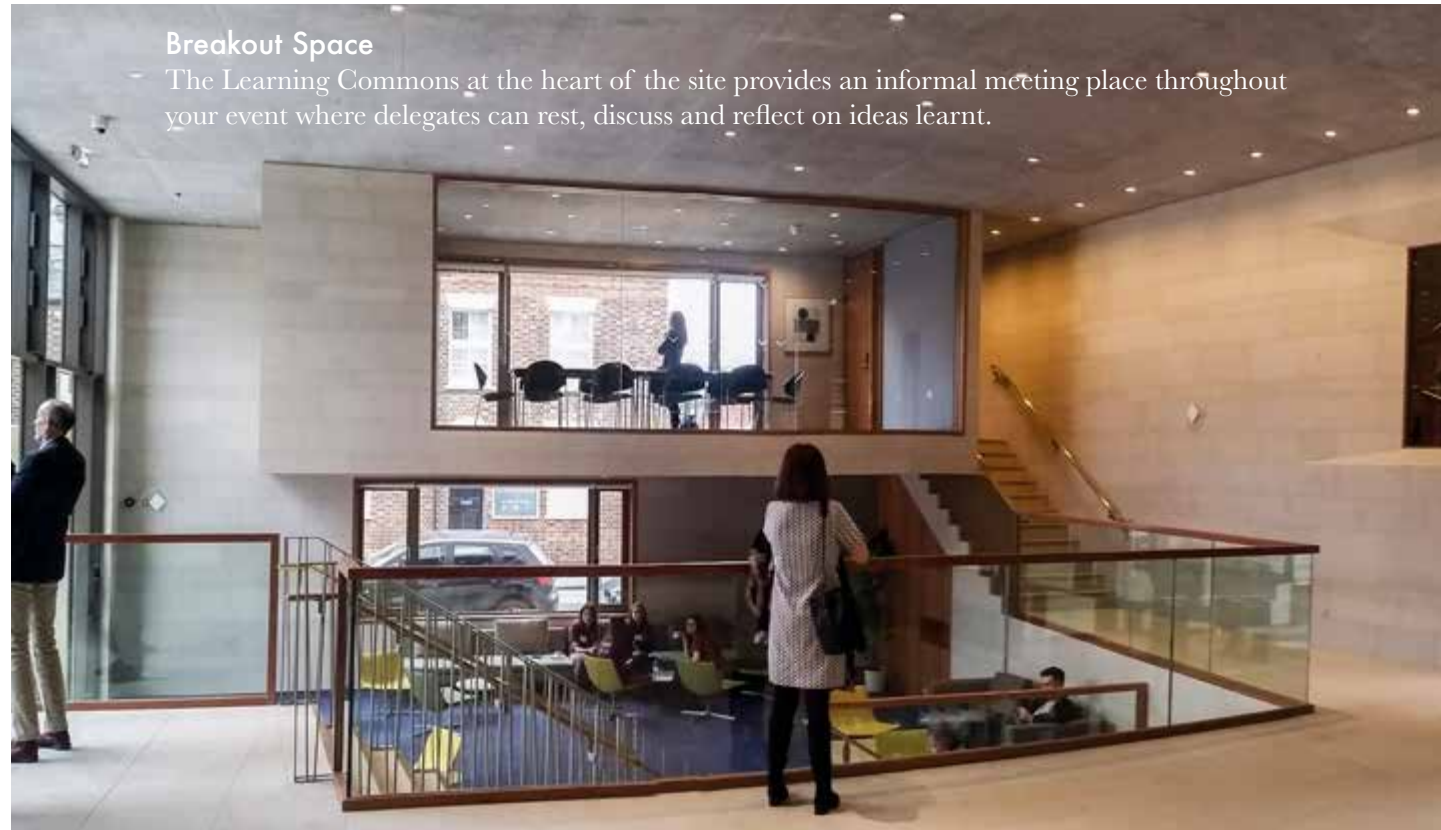


Seminar Rooms

The Learning Commons at the heart of the site provides an informal meeting place throughout your event where delegates can rest, discuss and reflect on ideas learnt.

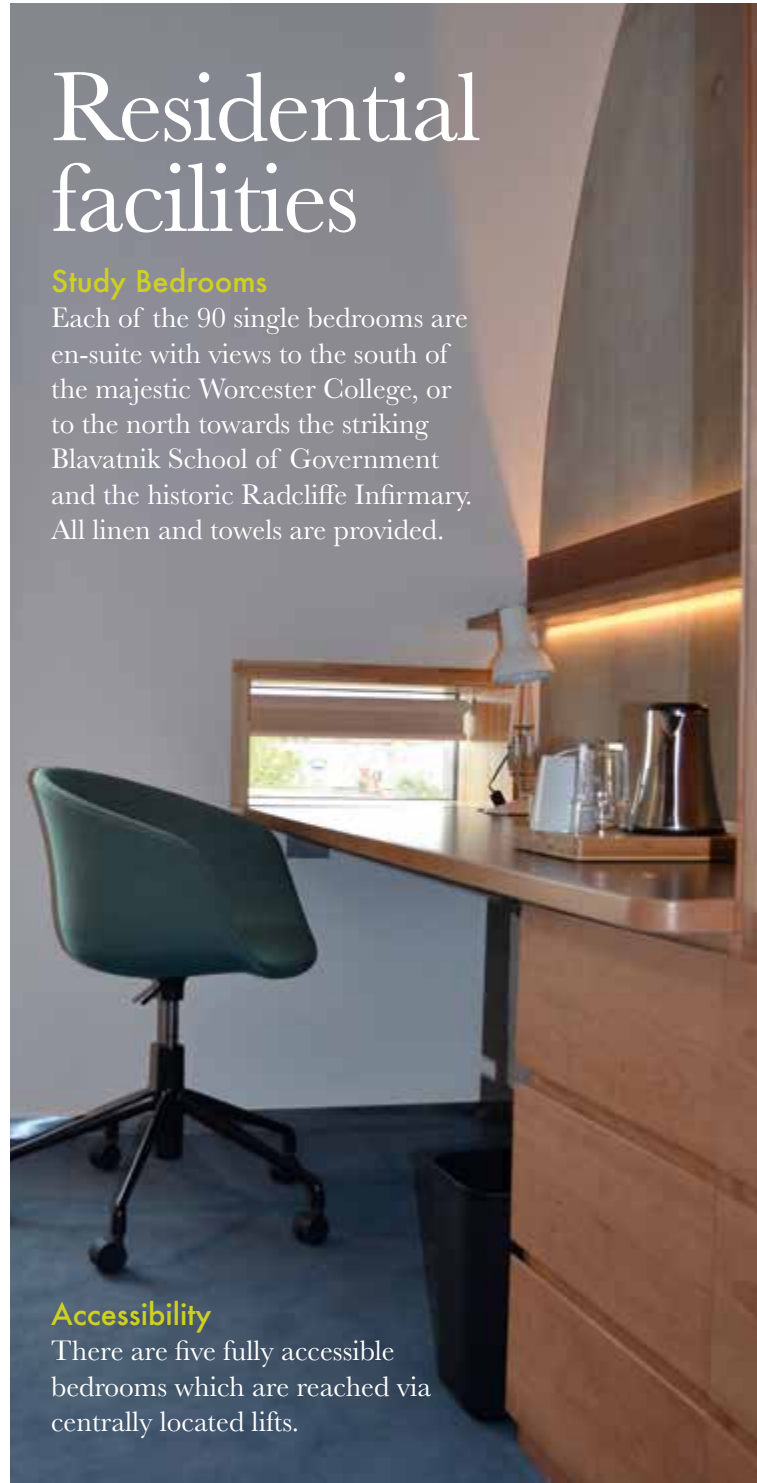




Residential facilities

Study Bedrooms

Each of the 90 single bedrooms are en-suite with views to the south of the majestic Worcester College, or to the north towards the striking Blavatnik School of Government and the historic Radcliffe Infirmary. All linen and towels are provided.



Accessibility

There are five fully accessible bedrooms which are reached via centrally located lifts.

Fitzhugh Auditorium

State of the art Audio-Visual facilities including digital projector, screen, white boards, and amplification.

Seminar Rooms

Smaller rooms with digital projector, screen, white boards and amplification.

Learning Commons & Mezzanine

Open space that can be reorganised for small break-out groups on multiple levels.

Outside Quadrangles

Suitable for coffee breaks or early evening drinks receptions.

Fine Dining

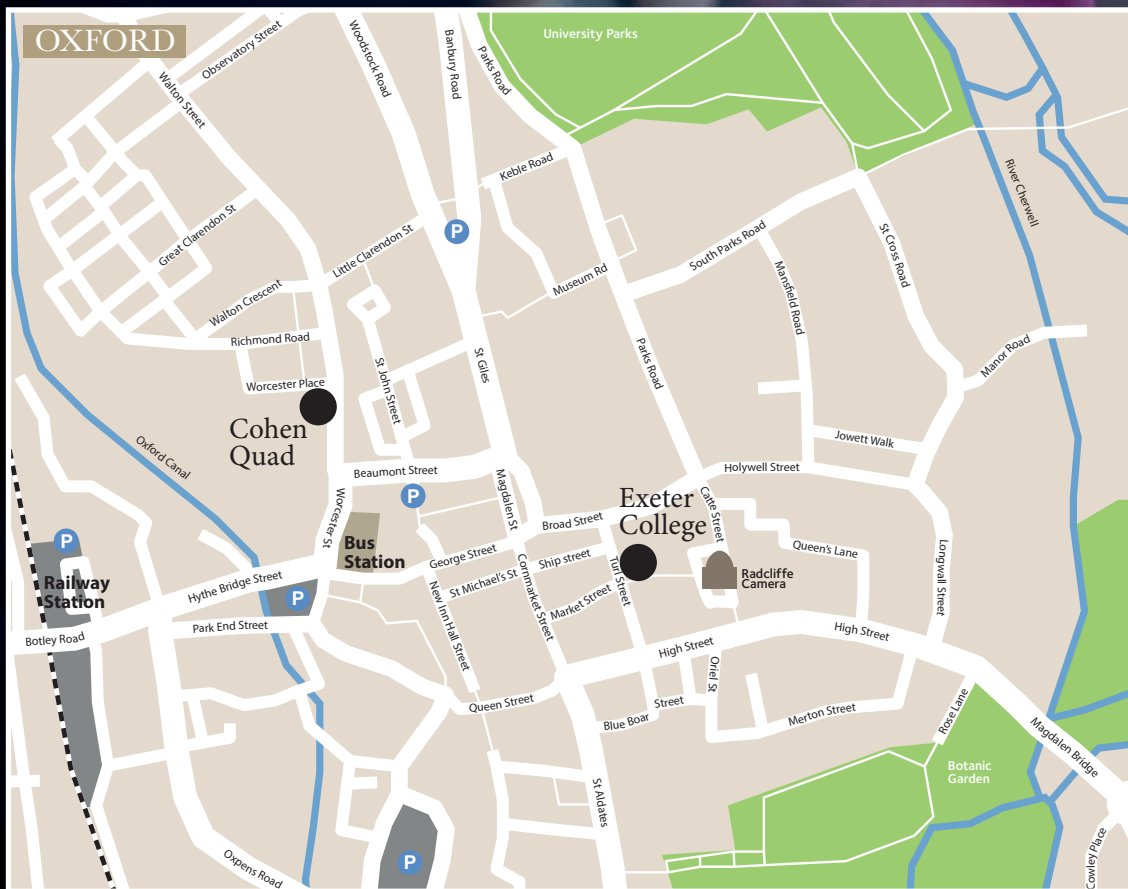

Family Kitchens

Each residential floor is equipped with a kitchen in which delegates can prepare light snacks.

By car - Like other historic cities Oxford was not built with motor transport in mind. If you are driving to Oxford it is advisable to use the Park and Ride service. There are five large Park and Ride areas on the city approaches, some with free car parking and frequent bus services into the city centre. The nearest parking is on Park End Street and short stay parking on Walton Street.

By train - Cohen Quad is a 5 minute walk from Oxford Station, via Hythe Bridge Street and Worcester Street.

By coach - The main coach station is in Gloucester Green off George Street. Cohen Quad is a short walk from the coach station.
